Update on Chinese Military-Industrial Complex Companies Executive Order

Update as of December 17, 2021

On June 3, 2021, the U.S. Government issued Executive Order 14032 ("EO 14032") amending an earlier Executive Order. The U.S. government identified the companies listed in the annex to EO 14032 as Chinese Military-Industrial Complex Companies ("CMICs") and imposed restrictions on transactions in the publicly traded securities of the CMICs. The purchase restrictions for the CMICs identified in the June 3, 2021 Annex took effect on August 2, 2021 and divestment is permitted until June 2, 2022. We further understand that when the U.S. government identifies additional companies as CMICs, the 60-day notice/1-year divestment period starts at the time such companies are added to the list of CMICs.

Dimensional Fund Advisors LP ("Dimensional") has and will continue to take steps to keep portfolios subject to EO 14032 in compliance with the evolving regulatory guidance on EO 14032:

- We will not purchase for any portfolio subject to EO 14032 any sanctioned CMIC securities on or after the applicable effective date of the sanctions;
- We intend to divest our Funds of all publicly traded securities that have been identified as CMICs by the U.S. Government prior to the end of the applicable divestment period.

Further, in relation to the non-U.S. commingled funds managed by Dimensional's affiliates that currently have one or more U.S. person investors, we will take steps to maintain eligibility for purchase by U.S. persons under EO 14032.

We continue to monitor developments related to EO 14032. The regulatory guidance on EO 14032 may develop further, which, in turn, may affect Dimensional's understanding of and approach to compliance with EO 14032.
